

Fruits & Vegetables

Asparagus - Mary Washington

This winter hardy variety is also heat tolerant and shows resistance to rust. This is an heirloom variety!

Best in zones 3-8

Flavor - Excellent

Freezing Quality - Excellent

pH recommended 7.0-7.2

Asparagus plants produce a light harvest in the 2nd year, a larger harvest the 3rd year, and a full harvest in subsequent years.



Asparagus – Jersey Knight

One of the New Jersey asparagus hybrids, Jersey Knight is extremely vigorous, has large, succulent spears, and quickly attracts a loyal following. The plant is resistant to rust, crown rot and fusarium. It also performs equally well in heavy, clay-like soils.

Best zone 3-8

Flavor – good

Freezing quality – excellent

pH recommended 7.0-7.2

Asparagus plants produce a light harvest in the 2nd year, a larger harvest the 3rd year, and a full harvest in subsequent years.



Horseradish – Big Top

We have selected the horseradish strain "Big Top" for its size, vigor, wide adaptability and resistance to foliage diseases, rust and bacterial spot (all common problems in horseradish). These horseradish plants are top performers; a few roots will last a lifetime! Best in zones 3-8

Flavor – excellent

pH recommended 6.2-6.7

Horseradish roots can be harvested during the 2nd fall after planting.



Rhubarb - MacDonald

We have selected this rhubarb strain for its excellent production for commercial growers and home gardeners. This very vigorous, upright growing strain produces large, tender stalks and has acceptable red color. Shows resistance to root-rot problems.

Best in zones 4-8

Recommended soil pH level of 6.0-6.8 for rhubarb crowns.

Rhubarb bears a light harvest in 2nd year and a full harvest in 3rd year.



Raspberry – Latham

A release from Minnesota, Latham raspberry combines good fruit quality with excellent winter hardiness.

Medium to large, bright-red fruit is rounded in shape but somewhat lacking in cohesion. Widely adapted, Latham is suitable for home gardens and pick-your-own operations.

Best in zones 3-8

pH recommended 6.5 - 6.8

This Summer Bearing Raspberry Plant bears fruit 1 year after planting.



Raspberry – Killarney

Released in 1961, Killarney raspberry is especially winter hardy. It is an early mid-season variety ripening about a week after Boyne. It has an attractive bright-red color and a good raspberry aroma and flavor. The canes grow upright, are medium-sized and sturdy. Best in zones 4-7

Recommended pH level of 6.5 - 6.8.

This Summer Bearing Raspberry Plant bears fruit 1 year after planting.



Blueberry – Northland

A variety developed by Michigan State University, has excellent winter hardiness. It has produced a consistent crop following winter temperatures as low as -30F. The medium-size berries are very flavorful, similar to wild blueberries. The plant grows to about 4 feet, with attractive foliage throughout the fall.

Best zones 3-7

Recommended pH level of 4.5-4.8.

Blueberry plants bear fruit 1 year after planting.



Blueberry – Patriot

Patriot is an early variety released by the University of Maine, where growing seasons are short and winter hardiness is a must. This variety is vigorous and grows upright to a height of 4 to 6 feet. Patriot adapts to many different soil types and has performed better in heavier soil than some other varieties. The fruit is large and has very good flavor.

Best in zones 4-7

Recommended pH level of 4.5 - 4.8.

Blueberry plants bear fruit 1 year after planting.



Blueberry – Bluecrop

The leading commercial blueberry variety grown and is especially popular in New Jersey and Michigan. It produces high yields of large, bright blue berries that are firm and grow in large clusters. The berry flavor is superb, fresh or frozen. Bluecrop is known for its hardiness, vigor and consistent production. The plant grows to a height of 4-6 feet.

Recommended pH level of 4.5 - 4.8

Blueberry plants bear fruit 1 year after planting.



Strawberry – Albion

Produces very large fruit that is mostly conical, very firm and red in color. Its flavor is very good for a day-neutral. To get the high yields it is capable of producing, this variety will need a stronger watering and nutrient program than any other everbearer. Wider plant spacing will deliver the largest berries.

Recommended soil pH of 6.5 - 6.8

This Day Neutral Strawberry Plant bears fruit 12-14 weeks after planting.



Strawberry – Jewel

One of our top sellers, Jewel performs well over a wide range of growing conditions. Jewel strawberry is our #1 midseason variety, recommended for commercial growers and home gardeners. Jewel has large berries with superb quality and flavor. We have been very successful using Jewel for home gardening due to its overall quality and consistent performance. Plants have moderate winter hardiness. Care must be taken at renovation to maintain a good plant stand. Recommended soil pH of 6.5-6.8 for strawberry plants.

This June Bearing Strawberry Plant bears fruit 1 year after planting.



Strawberry – Malwina

Bred in Germany, is a high quality, very late season variety (at least 7 days later than Record). Fruits are glossy and dark red having excellent flavor with high Brix readings. Berries are large and hold berry size well through the season. Regular pickings are suggested to maintain fruit firmness. With its very vigorous growth habit, nitrogen fertilizer needs to be managed to avoid excessive vegetative growth. Malwina shows resistance to mildew as well as tolerance to Verticillium wilt and red stele. Malwina is an excellent variety to extend the strawberry season. Recommend pH level of 6.5 - 6.8 This June Bearing Strawberry Plant bears fruit 1 year after planting.
