Borrower Agreement Clause

Conditions of Loan:

Items to be returned in a clean and oiled (as needed condition) – Coös County Conservation District reserve the right to process the retained check for unreturned tools, invoice the borrower for damage beyond normal wear and refuse further loans because of misuse.

This tool is funded through a USDA Specialty Crop Grant awarded to the Coös County Conservation District. Its purpose is to give commercial farm operations (of any size) an opportunity to try out its use (without cost) to determine its suitability to their farm, making their own purchase later from a supplier. To ensure longevity of the tool for others to try-out it is not for routine “lending-out”.

The Coös County Conservation District and UNH Cooperative Extension is held blameless for injuries or other damages resulting from the use of this tool.

I understand it is my personal responsibility to read and follow any instructions provided, check the tool for good operating condition before use, report any discrepancies, damages, etc. to the lending representative.
